Thomas S. Ward, 92, of Decatur, passed away Monday, March 21, 2016.

Tom was born March 20, 1924, in Decatur, IL, the son of William and Mary (Crisp) Ward. He proudly served his country in the United States Army during WWII earning a Purple Heart and a Bronze Star. He received his Bachelor's Degree from St. Joseph's College in Rensselaer, IN, and worked as a social worker for the State of Illinois. Tom married Evelyn Boehm on October 24, 1953, in Decatur, IL, and they shared 62 wonderful years together.

Tom was a member of the Disabled American Veterans and Holy Family Parish. He was a hard worker who loved to work around the house and the yard. He will be missed.
