Gary L. Sheumaker, 76, of Oakley, passed away Sunday, June 21, 2015 at Decatur Memorial Hospital.

Gary was born December 23, 1938 in Decatur, Illinois, the son of George H. and Freda (Tille) Sheumaker. He was previously employed as an engineer technician with the IL Division of Highways, an agent and telegrapher with the Wabash Railroad, and a draftsman and designer with A.E.
