Decatur-Agnes Jane Kolbeck, 80, of Decatur, passed away Monday, January 05, 2015 at St. Mary's Hospital in Decatur.

Agnes was born March 25, 1934 in Decatur, Illinois, the daughter of George and Sarah (Butler) Truebe. She graduated from St. John's School of Nursing. She was previously employed as a Registered Nurse and Director of Pastoral Care at St. Mary's Hospital retiring in 1994.
