Decatur- Lucille (King) Treadwell, 104, of Decatur, passed away August 23, 2013 at Fairhavens Christian Home, Decatur, IL.

Lucille was born April 5, 1909 to the late William and Maggie King in Starksville, MS. She accepted Christ at an early age at the Black Jack Baptist Church in Starksville, MS. She moved to St. Louis MO in 1942 and married Eddie Treadwell on February 16, 1943.

In 1946, the couple moved to Decatur, IL where she united with New Salem Baptist Church and later with Northside Baptist Church, where she sang in the choir and served until her health began to fail and she was unable to attend.

She worked various jobs as a cook and housekeeper through out her life.

She is survived by her step-daughters Carolyn Treadwell-Butler of Decatur, IL; Gwendolyn Treadwell-Musgrave of Davenport, IA; Pamela Treadwell-Waller of Waldorf, MD, 4 step-grand children, Alisha and Michelle Young of New York, NY; Talia Dixon and Zegory Musgrave of Davenport, IA. She was preceded in death by her parents, husband, one brother, and 5 sisters.
