Larry Dale Clark, 52 of Bloomington, died on Wednesday December 04, 2002 in Normal Illinois.

Services celebrating his life will be at 11 A.M. Monday, December 09, 2002 in J. J. Moran & Sons Funeral, with Pastor Lyle Artman officiating. Visitation will be on Sunday from 2 to 5 P.M. Burial will be in Graceland Cemetery.

Larry was born in Decatur on August 30, 1950 the son of Norman Dale and Anna S. Dulaney Clark.
