Decatur – William L. “Bill” Gosch, 83, of Decatur, passed away Sunday, March 29, 2020.

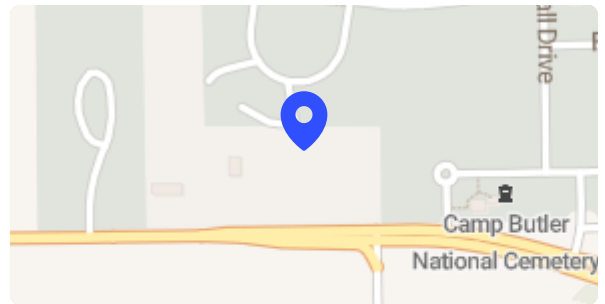
